18/01 - Louis Pasteur



#### Louis Pasteur

- Louis Pasteur's discoveries led to an understanding of microbes and diseases that has helped to save millions and millions of lives.
- Pasteur used his knowledge of germs to investigate how beverages such as wine and milk were spoiled by microbes such as bacteria and molds. He found that heating up the liquids would kill most of the microbes and allow the beverages to last longer and be safer to drink. This process became known as pasteurization and is still done on many foods today.
