Thursday 21st

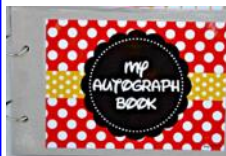
March - Mothers Day theme 'Make a gift for someone special - flowers in teacups. (Open to all school).

Jane Goodall

- Jane Goodall is an expert on wild chimpanzees. Recognised for her ground breaking discoveries about their behaviour - she discovered that chimpanzees make tools, eat and hunt for meat, and have similar social behaviour to humans - she completely transformed our understanding of our closest relative in the animal kingdom.
- She established the Jane Goodall Institute in 1977 to carry on research into chimpanzees.
