Mr Shapeshifter is a modern 'fairy tale' that depicts some adults' can abuse children's trust and highlights ways in which they can protect themselves.

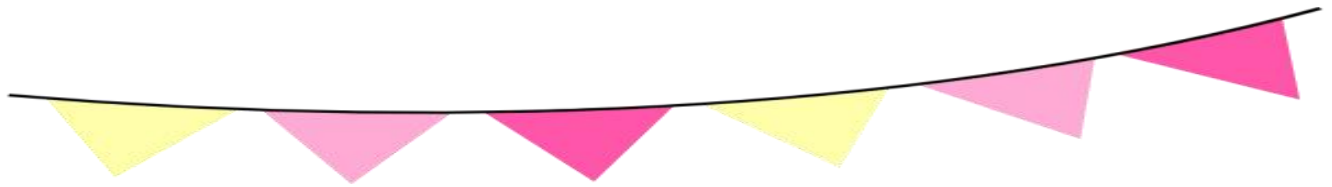
The resource is intended to reach as wide an audience as possible and is available online for anyone to use, supported by a free to access package of training materials and activities www.mrshapeshifter.com
