School Uniform

School uniform is compulsory. At Dean Field our uniform is:

- ⇒ A **royal blue** jumper or cardigan (with or without the school's logo on it)
- ⇒ A **pale blue** polo shirt or pale blue collared shirt
- ⇒ **Grey** or **black** trousers/skirts/dresses
- ⇒ **Grey** or **black** tights with skirts and dresses or in the summer white socks
- ⇒ **Pale blue** gingham summer dresses for girls in the summer
- ⇒ **Grey** or **black** shorts for the boys in the summer
- ⇒ Footwear should be **black**, safe and weather appropriate.

Please note that from September white polo shirts and white collared shirts will not be allowed. Pupils must only wear pale blue polo shirts or collared shirts; this has always been the uniform policy of the school. For pupils in years 5 and 6 there will be the option for them to purchase a blue tie from the school office.

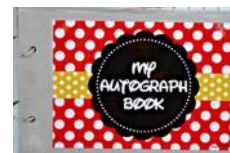
