## Safeguarding

### Returning to school after a holiday:

It's common for children to feel nervous about going back to school after the holidays or the summer. To help calm their nerves and make sure they're prepared for the school term you could try:

The programme works towards enhancing the education system in countries such as Uganda.

Miss Fudge, along with lots of lovely family, colleagues and friends, has secured enough fund raising money to attend the fellowship and has also contributed her own money towards vaccinations, flights and much more.

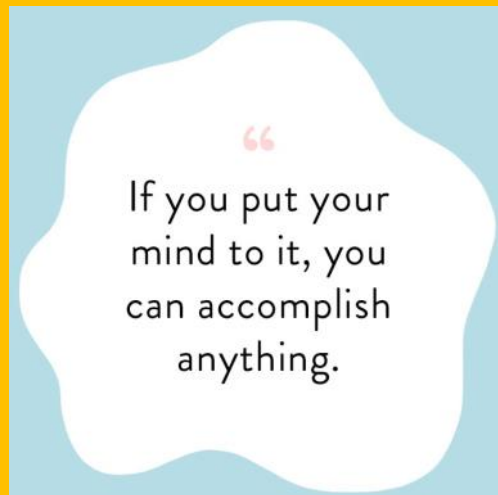

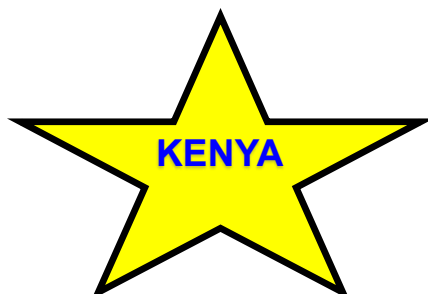
