Safeguarding

Safeguarding is the action that is taken to promote the welfare of children and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding means:

- protecting children from abuse and maltreatment
- preventing harm to children's health or development
- ensuring children grow up with the provision of safe and effective care
- taking action to enable all children and young people to have the best outcomes.

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process. It focuses on protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child.

Each and every one of us has a duty to safeguard, protect and promote the welfare of others. Safeguarding is everyone's business. If you suspect a child/children may be at risk of harm, call the Multi Agency Screening Team (MAST for short) on 01422 393336



Head Lice

Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice due to there being an outbreak in year 3.

To Check:

Check the scalp for insects or eggs.

Use a fine-tooth comb on wet hair then comb through the hair in sections looking for eggs or lice, repeat over a few days.

To Treat:

Wet the hair and scalp with conditioner or use a chemical shampoo/lotion (containing insecticide) – this will kill the lice and eggs. Using a fine metal comb, or special head lice comb you can get from a chemist, go through the hair in sections to comb the lice and eggs out.

Tips:

- Check and treat hair every night.
- Please tie up long hair for school.
- If your child has head lice please check everyone in the family home.
- Do not share hairbrushes, towels, hats, etc.
- Always retreat 7-10 days after the first treatment.

When to apply

When will my child start Nursery?

- If your child turns 3 between 1 September and 31 December – Term starting on or after 1 January
- If your child turns 3 between 1 January and 31 March – Term starting on or after 1 April
- If your child turns 3 between 1 April and 31 August – Term starting on or after 1 September

Healthy Holidays Calderdale

During the school holidays, children and young people who are on free school meals can access free holiday club places through our Healthy Holidays Calderdale programme.

This opportunity is provided as part of the government's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme. The free places are funded by the Department for Education (DfE). Find out more about the HAF 2022 government guidance.

The scheme provides enjoyable activities and nutritious meals for primary and secondary school-aged children who are eligible for benefitsrelated free school meals. We are developing inclusive places as part of Healthy Holiday provision.

How can I book my child on the Summer 2022 Programme?

Is my child eligible?

If your child is in Reception class to year 11 and are in receipt of benefits-related free school meals, they are eligible to attend the Healthy Holidays Calderdale programme.

Please note: benefits-related free school meals are different to Universal Infant Free School Meals that all children receive from Reception to year 2.

How Are Children with Additional Needs included?

All the programme partners are committed to making their programme accessible for a wide range of children. Providing the programme with good information about your child and their needs will enable them to ensure that your child is fully included and can enjoy the opportunities that are offered.

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
