Safeguarding

How do you teach children kindness and empathy?

- 1. Believe that your child is capable of being kind.
- 2. Model positive action.
- 3. Treat your child with respect.
- 4. Coach your child to pay attention to people's facial expressions.
- 5. Let your child know often that how they treat others matters to you greatly.
- 6. Don't let rudeness pass.
- 7. Acknowledge kindness.

Teaching Children to be Respectful of their Peers

Children who have respect instilled in them while growing up turn out to be more adaptive, conflict resilient people who find ways to manage difficult situations much easier.

They are also less inclined to bully other children in school and more likely to stand up for others.

As you are aware, respect is an essential quality and ability that we must teach our children.

The very basic formula of respect is empathy-recognising other person's boundaries.

Empathy is a conscious ability to put oneself in the mind of another individual and imagine what they are thinking and feeling.

Therefore teaching kids respect is basically teaching them conscious empathy and boundaries.

The most important thing is showing respectful behaviours in everyday life.

Year 4

Year 4 went to Leeds City Museum on Tuesday to attend an Ancient Egyptian workshop. The children looked around the museum at all the artefacts including the real life mummy of Nesyamun. The children had a lesson on the process of the mummification and even got to complete the process on human teddy. They learnt about what happened to the body during the afterlife journey.







Year 2

On Thursday this week the year 2 children visited Beech Hill School where they took part in an owl workshop! They got to meet 5 different owls and a harris hawk from the Wise Owl Bird Of Prey Sanctuary. We learned lots and lots about owls. Reception September 2023 Admission and Enrollment

Please find below the information regarding primary admissions to enroll your child to Dean Field Reception class in September 2023.

A guide has been sent out via Seesaw to help you in submitting your school application for your child to start with us in Reception September 2023. You can apply online from 18th November 2022 and **the closing date is 15th January 2023**.

If you need computer access or support then let us know and you can apply on a device in school. Please note, from experience, you need to submit your application before the deadline 15th January 2023 to receive the best chance at getting a confirmed Dean Field place otherwise your child could be given a different school. How to apply for a school place

Children born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019 are due to start primary school in September 2023.

To apply for a school place you must **apply online by 15 January 2023** at **www.calderdale.gov.uk/admissions**.

For advice and guidance regarding the application process please contact 01422 392617, option 1, and a Customer First Advisor will be able to assist you.

If you would like a leaflet about applying for a primary school place please contact your preferred school and register your child's name. The leaflet will then be distributed by the primary school at the end of November 2022.

Information relating to Admission to Primary School 2023, including oversubscription criteria, is available at www.calderdale.gov.uk/admissions.

The application process opens on 18 November 2022 and the close date is 15 January 2023

Offers of school places will be made on 17 April 2023.
