Staff Training

Parental controls help you to block or filter upsetting or inappropriate content, and control purchases within apps. You can install parental control software on your child's and family phone, tablets, games consoles, laptops and your home Internet.

Parental controls can help you to:

- Plan what time of the day your child can go online and how long for
- Create content filters to block apps that may have **inappropriate content**
- Manage the content different family members can see




Free school uniforms at Morrisons supermarket in Illingworth
