Calderdale Smart Move

On Tuesday this week, Dom and Paula from the charity Calderdale Smart Move visited Dean Field to introduce our Harvest Festival collection. They explained what the charity does and who/how it helps. Something that can be easily made by someone who is perhaps not used to or not skilled at cooking. Staff Training

This week various staff have attended Trauma Training from Amelia Brunt who highlighted the importance of Attachment, Belonging and Connections (ABC). Staff learned a variety of knowledge on how to identify signs of emotional distress and how best to support children to work through this.

Miss Clay and Miss Hussain have previously attended the above training so instead they completed Iris Connect training. Iris is a system staff use to share good teaching techniques in order to reflect on and provide support to other staff members.

Also this week teachers have explored Dean Field's spelling resource 'Spelling Shed', an online resource used to promote children's spelling skills.

S Safe: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information when you're chatting or posting online, personal information includes your email address, password or phone number.

M Meet: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do this with your parents/carers permission and then only with them present. Remember online friends are still strangers, even if you have been talking to them for a long time.

A Accepting: Accepting emails, messages, opening files, Images or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems..... they may contain viruses or nasty messages.

R Reliable: Someone online might lie about who they are and information they give may not be true. Always check information.

T Tell: Tell a parent/carer or a trusted adult if someone, something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.














Family of Learning Trust Sports Day - Year 3 and Year 4




