### What are the risks and dangers of Snapchat?

- Inappropriate or harmful content. Children and young people could be at risk of viewing harmful or upsetting video content and images.
- Location sharing. Snapchat Map shares your location with other users on the app.
- Unwanted contact.
- Pressure to share.
- Pressure to chat.


### Why is using Snapchat a red flag?

Respondents said those who use the app too much can come off as self-absorbed, which is a sign of low confidence. Additionally, 80% said that someone being too into Snapchat is a red flag. Not only might it signal that the person is self-absorbed, but it also creates more opportunities to gain unwanted attention.

#### Social media harms

Distracting them, disrupting their sleep, and exposing them to bullying, rumor spreading, unrealistic views of other people's lives and peer pressure. The risks might be related to how much social media children use.

We had a lovely time looking at genuine and replica dinosaur fossils including a replica Allosaurus skull with very sharp teeth, a genuine dinosaur egg and a complete Triceratops leg bone. We also produced our own fossils using Brass Rubbing techniques and Plaster of Paris moulding.



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### Right of the Week



This weeks' article is article 13 – 'children have the right to share freely with others what they learn, think and feel, by talking, drawing, writing or in any other way unless it harms other people.'

At Dean Field, we always encourage pupils to share their thoughts and feelings on different topics. We encourage this through our weekly Picture News discussion topic where pupils are encouraged to openly share their opinion on a current topic. We also encourage our pupils to share their thoughts and feelings in different areas of the curriculum to allow them to deepen their understanding. This is communicated in a variety of ways from talking and drawing to writing and presenting information to others.



### Medicine

If you child requires medicine during school hours, a parental medical agreement has to be completed at the school office.

School can only give medicine that has been prescribed by a Doctor and has the pharmacy label with the child's name on and is to be given more than 3 times a day.

Medicine given 3 times a day or less can be given at home.

### PAY MONEY INTO YOUR CHILDCARE ACCOUNT

> Your childcare provider(s) must sign up to receive Tax-Free Childcare payments.



### **PAY YOUR CHILDCARE** PROVIDER(S)

Use the money in your childcare account, including the government top up, to make one off or regular payments to your childcare provider(s).



### RECONFIRM

To continue getting the government top-up, you'll need to confirm your details are up to date every 3 months. We'll send a reminder when you need to do this.
