What are parental controls?

Parental controls are the names for a group of settings that put you in control of what content your child can see. Combined with privacy settings, these can help you protect your children from inappropriate content, online grooming, cyberbullying and other online safety issues. Remember that parental control settings are only one part of online safety. Make sure to keep having regular conversations about their online lives to stay on top of any issues that come up.

This weeks' article is article 28 – access to education. Every child should have the access to education and primary and secondary education should be free. Children should also be encouraged to receive an education to the highest possible level.

At Dean Field, we promote a love for learning and education from EYFS to year 6 so that pupils learn to value and respect the education system. We

encourage pupils to reach their highest potential across all subjects in the national curriculum. Alongside this, we also endeavour to

provide pupils with other additional experiences to encourage them to access higher education in the future. We do this through our school trips, the wide range of enrichment clubs that we offer and other in school experiences we provide for our pupils.



Every week, your child will take part in a PE lesson. All children should be suitably dressed in the correct school PE kits for their lessons. This should be black pumps or trainers, blue shorts or trousers and a white t-shirt. **There should be no logos or anything else printed on clothing (e.g. no Nike, Adidas etc.).** If children do not have their kits, a message on Seesaw should be sent out and if it becomes persistent a phone call to be made.



If your child has long hair, please can you make sure their hair is tied up. No jewelry, including earrings are allowed during the lesson. If your child cannot take their earrings out, they will be taped up.

Reception September 2023 Admission and Enrollment

Please find below the information regarding primary admissions to enroll your child to Dean Field Reception class in September 2023.

A guide has been sent out via Seesaw to help you in submitting your school application for your child to start with us in Reception September 2023. You can apply online from 18th November 2022 and **the closing date is 15th January 2023**.

If you need computer access or support then let us know and you can apply on a device in school. Please note, from experience, you need to submit your application before the deadline 15th January 2023 to receive the best chance at getting a confirmed Dean Field place otherwise your child could be given a different school.
