Staff Training

Miss Clay has attended the termly SENDCo meeting held by the Local Authority. The focus for this term's session was supporting pupils with a diagnosis or on the pathway to a diagnosis of ADHD. Miss Clay will disseminate to the relevant information to teachers in spring 2.

Our EYFS staff are also having ongoing training through Dingley's Promise so we can achieve their Mark of Achievement status. We are working towards this so we can show our commitment to pupils in the Early Years with additional needs and so our staff can identify pupils with SEND early and we can ensure they get the help and support they need.



SAFEGUARDING

Staying Home Alone—NSPCC

While every child is different, we wouldn't recommend leaving a child under 12 years old home alone, particularly for longer periods of time.

Children in primary school aged 6-12 are usually too young to walk home from school alone, babysit or cook for themselves without adult supervision.

If you need to leave them home, it's worth considering leaving them at a friend's house, with family or finding some suitable childcare. We have advice about this below.

Checking your child feels safe home alone

As your child gets older, talk to them about how they feel about being left home alone. If they're worried, work out what parts of being home alone worry them. Do they feel safe in the neighbourhood? Are they afraid of the dark?

Talk about anything that's bothering them and discuss a solution. Understanding why they don't feel comfortable will give you an idea of how to help – or why they might not be ready to be left alone.

We would always recommend leaving a child younger than 12 years old with family, a friend or in childcare.


Safer Internet Day

The school lottery helps support our school so we can buy extra resources and do extra curricular activities.


