'It is the essential knowledge that pupils need to be educated citizens, introducing them to the best that has been thought and said and helping to engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement."



Cultural Capital is the accumulation of knowledge, behaviours and skills that a student can draw upon and which demonstrates their cultural awareness, knowledge and competence. It is one of the key ingredients a student will need to be successful at secondary school, in further education and eventually their career and the world of work.

At Dean Field Primary School, we believe that the values of our school underpin the SMSC development of all learners. We recognise that the personal development of pupils, spiritually, morally, socially and culturally, not only plays a significant part in their ability to learn and achieve, but also adds to their cultural capital. Therefore, we take a cross-curricular approach that provides pupils with opportunities to explore and develop SMSC so that they are equipped with the capital needed for life in diverse, modern Britain.

We are also committed to promoting a safe and healthy lifestyle. We believe that PSHE and RSE is an integral part of the education of our pupils. We aim to offer pupils a carefully planned program on human development, relationships, sexuality and family life within a safe, comfortable atmosphere. We use Jigsaw as a whole school approach to teaching PSHE and RSE. 
Kenya class learnt all about their class country. They learnt about the Kenyan culture and learnt how to locate it on a map.




China class learnt their months of the year in a creative way by singing a song!





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
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China class learnt about Barak Obama as their black key figure during black history month. They learnt about his biggest achievement of being the first black president of the United States.




Poland class learnt about Rosa

inspiring!

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




Mexico class learnt why we wear poppies and then used different materials to make their own poppies.

The whole school took part in Odd Sock Day to raise awareness about Anti-Bullying Week.




