Top Vocabulary

Synagogue - the building where a Jewish congregation meets for religious worship

The torah - the special book in Judaism

Hebrew - the language the Torah is written in

Covenant - a covenant is a special promise between God and people.

Sabbath - the day of rest observed from Friday evening to Saturday evening

Passover/Pesach - a celebration of the story of Exodus

Kosher - food that meets the Jewish dietary rules

Seder - the special family meal at Pesach

During Passover, Jews remember how their ancestors left slavery behind them when they were led out of Egypt by Moses.



Jewish people recall the faithfulness of god through celebration of Pesach.
