



# RE Unit 6.2 What do Christians believe about Jesus' death and resurrection?

## Top Vocabulary

**Palm Sunday** - Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Easter that begins the Holy Week.

**Crucifixion** - is a method of capital punishment in which the victim is tied or nailed to a large wooden cross or beam and left to hang until eventual death

**Easter** - festival where Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus following his crucifixion and death

**Resurrection** - the resurrection of Jesus is the Christian belief that he returned to life by a miracle

**Ascension** - Ascension day is the 40th day after Easter and it was the final day that Jesus was seen; on this day he was taken on heaven.

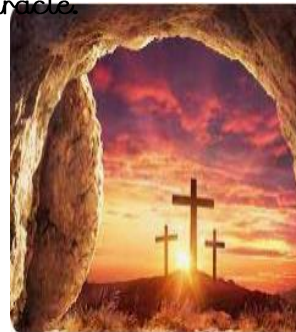
**Pentecost** - Pentecost is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter.

Palm Sunday is the Sunday before Easter that begins the Holy Week.



Palm Sunday is the marking of the final days of Christ and his triumphant arrival into Jerusalem.

Easter Sunday marks Jesus's resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus is the Christian belief that he returned to life by a miracle.



The Last Supper was the final meal Jesus shared with his disciples, the night before his crucifixion.



During the meal, Jesus predicted that one of his disciples would betray him.

Ascension day is the 40th day after Easter and it was the final day that Jesus was seen; on this day he was taken on heaven.



Good Friday marks the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.



Christians believe that the day is called Good Friday because Jesus died so that everyone could be forgiven for the things they had done wrong.
