**Rites of passage** - a rite of passage is a ritual or experience that marks a major milestone or change in a person's life.

**Confirmation** - a religious ceremony that strengthens the baptised Christian's bond with the Church.

**Baptism** - Baptism is a ceremony that symbolises a commitment to living a life as a Christian.

**Amrit** - Amrit is the ceremony where a Sikh person becomes a part of the Khalsa.

**Bar Mitzvah** - a ceremony to mark the transition into adulthood for young Jewish males.

**Bat Mitzvah** - a ceremony to mark the transition into adulthood for young Jewish females.

A rite of passage is a ritual or experience that marks a major milestone or change in a person's life.



A Bar or Bat Mitzvah is a ceremony that marks the time when a boy or girl becomes a Jewish adult. This means that they are now responsible for their own actions and can decide for themselves how they would like to practice Judaism.



Amrit is the ceremony where a Sikh person becomes a part of the Khalsa. The Khalsa is the collective body of all initiated Sikhs.



Confirmation is a religious ceremony that strengthens the baptised Christian's bond with the Church.



A believer's baptism is the practice of baptising those who are able to make a conscious profession of faith.
