




# Year 1 - Autumn 2- The Gunpowder Plot

- \* Guy Fawkes was a gunpowder expert.
- \* Guy Fawkes and his friends had different beliefs to King James I so plotted to kill him.
- \* A letter was sent to warn King James I.
- \* The men were caught trying to blow up the Houses of Parliament and kill King James I.
- \* King James I ordered that people should celebrate his survival on the 5th November.
- \* Bonfire Night is celebrated every year on the 5<sup>th</sup> November.
- \* Because of this, people light fires and set off fire works.
